In April 2013, Justine Curran was appointed Chief Constable of Humberside Police, having previously served as Chief Constable for Tayside Police, following promotion from DCC. Her roles in Scotland included that of Vice-President of the Association of Chief Police Officers in Scotland (ACPOS) and Chair of ACPOS People, Diversity and Development Business Area. Her current national portfolio is that of ACPO lead for Public Order and Public Safety.

Prior to moving to Scotland, Justine served as Assistant Chief Constable for Greater Manchester Police running the territorial divisions and taking the lead on the development of local policing in Neighbourhood Policing and Citizen Focus and heading up the regional Counter Terrorism Unit. She was also the lead for public order, football and other events, taking the role of Gold Commander for the UEFA Cup Final when there was significant disorder.

Her earlier roles have been as Divisional Commander for GMP city centre and as Superintendent with Merseyside Police. Amongst her many demanding functions, she commanded many high-profile football matches (including England internationals) and big political events in and the Grand National.

Justine is a graduate of Hull University and has also obtained a Masters Degree in Police Management.

Justine was awarded the QPM in the Birthday Honours list 2013. She lives in the East Riding of Yorkshire with her husband, Gordon Meldrum (who works within the National Crime Agency) and her two children.
