DCC Fish joined Nottinghamshire Police in 1986 as a Police Constable, working in a variety of uniform and detective roles.

During her service she has had specific responsibilities for the Force Crime Directorate, Force Intelligence Directorate, Scientific Support, Operational Support, Serious & Organised Crime and is also a Gold Firearms, Public Order and CBRN Commander.

In 1999 DCC Fish moved to West Midlands Police as a Superintendent and was the Deputy Divisional Commander for South Sandwell, and from 2001 to 2003 was Head of Operations for the West Midlands Police Force. She successfully completed the 2003 Strategic Command Course and was subsequently appointed Assistant Chief Constable in Nottinghamshire.

In April 2009 DCC Fish began a secondment with ACPO working on the national Tackling Knife Crime and Serious Youth Violence programme. This was followed by a secondment to the Met Police where she led on a programme to roll out the digitalisation of case files across 32 London boroughs.

She returned to her post as ACC in Nottinghamshire on 1 June 2012, and took up the post of DCC on Friday 14 June 2013. Sue also became the ACPO lead for business crime in January 2013.

Mrs Fish was awarded the OBE for services to policing in the Queen's Birthday Honours in 2008, and in the same year was recognised by the Nottingham Business Awards as Woman Achiever of the Year.

She is married to James, and has three children Tom, Emma and Georgie.
