Ingrid Lee joined WYP in 1985 serving within the Bradford District. Since that time she has worked in predominantly investigative roles as a detective at all ranks across West Yorkshire specialising in serious and organised crime.

In 2000 Ingrid became a DI and DCI in what was the National Crime Squad now the National Crime Agency in investigative roles covering the North East and North West of the country but often with national and international context.

Ingrid returned to WYP in 2004 taking up post as DCI Crime Manager within Bradford before moving in 2006 to DCI Operations in the Drugs and Organised Crime Division. In 2007 Ingrid was promoted to Detective Superintendent Operations, Crime Division where she has led a number of high profile investigations and in 2008 became the Superintendent responsible for Neighbourhoods and Partnerships in Wakefield District.

In 2010 Ingrid was promoted to the West Yorkshire, Head of Crime where she has lead a number of complex investigations including counter corruption, serious and organised crime and the force response to Child Sexual exploitation and serious sexual offences. She has also restructured and realigned specialist crime provision so that it is multi-disciplined, more responsive, accountable and better able to tackle issues affecting local communities.

In November 2012 Ingrid was temporarily promoted to her current position as Assistant Chief Constable, Specialist crime with responsibility for the seven forces of the North East Counter Terrorism Unit, the Yorkshire and Humber Serious and Organised Crime Collaboration and West Yorkshire Police, Protective Services Crime with responsibility for Homicide and Major Enquiries, Serious and Organised Crime, Intelligence, Safeguarding/Protecting Vulnerable People, Hi-tech Crime and Economic/Financial Crime.

In August 2014, Ingrid moves on promotion to South Yorkshire Police as Assistant Chief Constable of Specialist Crime.

Ingrid has received a number of national awards and recognition for, criminal investigation, protecting vulnerable people and also was awarded the Queens Police Medal for her contribution to serious and organised crime in 2012

Ingrid is married with three children and enjoys a wide range sports, hill walking and keeping fit when time permits, recently completing the 3 Yorkshire Peaks.
